



The Good Pantry Lismore to open at former Wyrallah Road Food Hub

Many people across the Northern Rivers are still desperately flood-affected. The **Diocesan Flood Appeal** has been generously supported by donors across the country and around the world. Bishop Greg has carefully considered the needs of our community, and decided to support causes that will have lasting benefits for the largest number of people.

The first initiative will be to launch **The Good Pantry Lismore**, in partnership with the Lismore Soup Kitchen (The Winsome). The facility will sell dry pantry items at low cost for people in need, particularly flood-affected residents and Health Care Card holders from Monday 18th July.

The Good Pantry Lismore will open weekdays from 10.00am to 3.00pm at 51 Wyrallah Road, East Lismore.
