FROM THE HOLY FAMLY LENNOX HEAD COMMITTEE SUE HETHERINGTON, CHAIR HELHC

A simple, dark, vintage church, stripped bare of excess furniture, flowers, hymn books, Bulletins, notice boards covered in fine fabric, surprised those entering candle lit Holy Family church for Taize in August and October. As full moon shone and surf roared, eyes saw the San Damiano Cross icon, mounted on red velvet, at the altar and lit by searchlights.

This backdrop evoked the Taize tenets of kindness, simplicity and reconciliation of heart. Silence followed by Taize bells ringing from history, welcomed many parishioners, visitors, other faith members, people of different nationalities, and children.

Bernadette McQuillan invited us to listen "with the ear of the heart" and invoke the Holy Spirit. Thank you Bernadette for sharing your talent, bringing Taize to Holy Family church and accepting requests to return and

facilitate Taize Beachside Meditation twice in winter 2026.

October's banner proclaiming Rosary in the Public Square unfurled at Lennox's main intersection and was obvious to all. Large numbers of parishioners, visitors from other localities, including children holding candles, gathered . Under the trees, beside the ocean, Marie led us in a moving recitation of the Rosary. We thank Marie and also Phil Chapman who provided the sound system.

Holy Family church now has the NBN installed, with the internet to follow, ultimately leading to installing security cameras. Once cameras are in place, our church will be open during school terms, for prayer and contemplation, as is St Francis Xavier church.



It takes more than offering a Bulletin with a smile to make all who enter our church feel welcome. The Mass is pivotal to our faith. Some parishioners find sitting in silence a welcome relief from a busy life. Some find sitting in silence takes effort, whether adult or child. Provided at Holy Family church are cushions, children's Bulletins, colouring in sheets, packets of coloured and lead pencils, and colourful children's books. The Committee is mindful that we live in a Ballina community that experienced the trauma of flood, and we have in our community first responders, those working with vulnerable people, care givers and neurodiverse adults and children, who may benefit from having sensory items available in the church to calm. These items are now mainstream in schools and workplaces. In 2026 a container of assorted sensory items will be placed on the table inside the main entrance for the use of those coming to Mass.

The Holy Family Lennox Head Committee comprising Cheryl and Peter Bowen, Genevieve Starr and Marie and Kevin Sullivan held our final meeting last Friday. The role of the Committee is to care for the church and its people. The numbers are growing, welcoming initiatives are supported and the church site steadily is improving to welcome all. I thank each of the Committee members for demonstrating how to live a purposeful existence, through displays of radical kindness and compassion in the collection that is our community, our Parish. I thank them because their involvement makes our community vital; they keep turning up, once a month, serving all. May God bless you richly.

We thank Courtney Hyde and Annette and Julian White who have been part of the Sacristan team who weekly prepare so we can have Mass in our town. There are many Baptisms at Lennox Head and the Sacristans are often the first point of call for new parents, some stepping into a church for the first time. Thank you for your gift of service to Holy Family Church community.

Looking forward to 2026, I invite you to take note and talk with your family about a captivating opportunity held annually at Lennox Head. At Easter, in 2025, strangers walking by and café visitors were taking selfies with the large cross, draped in white, with the sun shining behind on the ocean. Easter is the most important feast of the year which we celebrate with Mass.

Also on Easter Sunday, before Mass, the Catholic and Anglican communities unite to stage a communal Easter prayer at Ross Park as the sun rises, to encourage all to celebrate with us in a public space. In 2026 Father Erick will prepare the service.

We thank Father Peter and Father Erick for their enthusiasm and support with Holy Family initiatives. We thank Bernadette at the Parish Office for helping to put our plans into action. It has been a year of joyful growth and we look forward to continuing to implement our strategic plan as we care for our Church and its people.

The Faith Formation Team has been busy over the last few months running the Catholic Alpha Australia Program, preparing RCIA Candidates to be

welcomed into the full faith of the Catholic Church, organising the Parish Pilgrimage, A Symphony of Prayer, presentations on Voluntary Assisted Dying and A Walk through the Gospel of Matthew, Journey through the Bible and the Advent Relection Day.

YEAR OF HOPE PARISH PILGRIMAGE

Pilgrimage from St Francis Xavier Parish to St Carthage's Cathedral, Lismore.

We gathered in joy and reverence, united as one faithful community on a sacred journey. After entering the cathedral through the Holy Door, we began with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by praying the Holy Rosary and the opportunity for reconciliation. We concluded with the blessing of the Blessed Sacrament.

Our pilgrimage was part of our celebration of the 2025 Holy Year of Jubilee, whose theme is "Pilgrims of Hope." An indulgence is a beautiful sign of God's abundant mercy, extended through the Church to free us from the lingering effects of sin. As the late Pope Francis reminded us, "The Jubilee indulgence is a way of discovering the unlimited nature of God's mercy" (Spes non confundit). Through this grace, we draw nearer to God and share more deeply in His divine love.


The weekly Wednesday evening meetings helped foster a deep bond among the group. So much so that they have decided to continue meeting next year to keep sharing and growing together in faith.





Year of Jubilee - Pilgrimage

On Friday 24 October, the staff and students shared in activities and a Pilgrimage in recognition of the Year of Jubilee. The Year of Jubilee is a special time of forgiveness and celebration and occurs every 50 years. The Jubilee Year of 2025, called "Pilgrims of Hope," is a special Holy Year that began in December 2024 and will conclude in October 2025. Staff and students participated in activities at school where they created 'Pilgrim Footprints', 'Pilgrim necklaces' made of shells, 'Hope Chains' and participated in 'Contemplative Prayer' in the Parish Gardens. Staff and students also went on a 'pilgrimage' to Fawcett Park where they reflected and meditated whilst overlooking the Richmond River. This was a wonderful day of reflection, learning and fun in recognition of the Year of Jubilee.

Class Retreats

During Term 4, each class will be participating in class retreats based on a Scripture passage they are learning about during Religious Education lessons. Here are some of the retreats we have had so far...

Year 2 shared in a retreat based on the Parable of the Good Samaritan. The students participated in activities which focused on the theme 'We show love for God by loving and helping everyone, even people we don't know or who are different from us. A 'neighbour' is anyone we meet who needs our help'. The Year 2 students received a small gift to remind them that they are "Super Samaritans" and that they should always stop and help others who are hurting, just like the man in the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Year 6 students shared in a retreat based around the theme 'hope' from the scripture Genesis 12:1-9. The scripture focused on the story of Abram & Sarai. The Year 6 students participated in a range of activities including 'Taking a leap of Faith' and "Hope: God is Faithful to His Promise." Our Year 4 students joined in the Accendere retreat. This retreat is based on the Scripture of John 13: 34-35 - 'And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples.' During the retreat, the students looked at 'what makes a good friend?', 'how did Jesus treat his friends?' and 'how to be a good friend?'

Year 6 Excursion - Sydney and Canberra

Our Year 6 excursion to Sydney and Canberra was an unforgettable week filled with learning, discovery, and experiences that brought classroom learning to life in exciting and meaningful ways. The students embraced every opportunity with enthusiasm and represented St Francis Xavier with pride.

The journey began in Sydney with a guided tour of the Sydney Opera House, where students were fascinated by the stories behind one of the world's most iconic architectural landmarks. A visit to Mary MacKillop Place offered a moment of reflection as students learned about Australia's first saint and her lasting legacy of service and compassion.

Canberra provided a rich tapestry of educational experiences. At Parliament House, students explored the chambers and developed a deeper understanding of Australia's democratic processes. The beauty and scale of the National Arboretum and the charming miniature worlds of Cockington Green captivated students as they explored these unique spaces.

Throughout the week, students visited a wide range of national institutions including the Film and Sound Archives, Australian Institute of Sport, National Museum of Australia, National Gallery, National Portrait Gallery, the Australian Botanic Gardens, and the always engaging Questacon. Each venue offered hands-on learning, inspiring curiosity in science, history, culture, art, and sport.

A particularly moving highlight was the moment our School Captains, Evie and Reef, were invited to lay a wreath during the Closing Ceremony at the Australian War Memorial—a proud and solemn occasion for our school community. The final day began bright and early as the group travelled back to Sydney to explore Taronga Zoo, where students delighted in close encounters with native and exotic animals. The journey home turned into an unexpected adventure when severe storms prevented our plane from landing in Ballina, resulting in a diversion to the Gold Coast. A quick bus trip returned the group safely to Ballina, where very relieved parents welcomed their tired travellers—three hours later than planned, but full of stories to tell. Throughout the excursion, our students were continually praised by members of the public for their respectful behaviour and positive attitude.

We extend our sincere thanks to Mrs Danielle Niland, Mr Chris Hosie, Mrs Laurel Newton, Mrs Kealey Bertram and Mr Tony Hunter for accompanying the students. This memorable trip marks a special chapter in the Year 6 students' final year of primary school.

St Francis Xavier Primary: Learning and Teaching News

A Wonderful Welcome: Kindergarten 2026 Transition Program Concludes

It's been an incredibly exciting term watching our future 2026 Kindergarten students participate in the Transition to School Program! On Monday, November 10th, they marked their sixth and final visit before they officially join us next year, and we couldn't be prouder of how quickly and confidently they have settled in. Their final session was a truly special milestone designed to make the final step into 'big school' as smooth and enjoyable as possible. The children spent quality time with their assigned Year 5 Buddies, marking the formation of a crucial, supportive relationship that will continue when they start school in 2026.

Lunch, Laughter, and Learning the Layout

A highlight of their Monday visits is enjoying lunch together in the primary school setting, followed by dedicated playtime. Sharing this important routine helps the students feel comfortable in the busy school environment. The children, guided by their teachers, embarked on a comprehensive school tour. Getting to know the lay of the land is essential for building confidence. Their tour included all the key locations they will be visiting often:

- The Canteen, where they'll order their lunch.
- The School Office, the hub for all important administrative tasks.
- The Principal's Office, a friendly place to visit. Couldn't believe we fitted two classes of Kinders into Mr Hunter's Office.
- The Library, where a whole world of stories awaits them.
- The K-6 classrooms and the surrounding playground areas.

The Benefits of a Strong Transition

The success of these transition visits is clear. Each session is carefully designed to address the common anxieties associated with starting school and maximise preparedness. The children are already reaping the benefits of this program:

- Meeting Key Staff: They've had the chance to meet and interact not only with their future Kindergarten teachers but also other staff members, like our Principal and the office team. This familiarity transforms strangers into friendly faces.
- Getting to Know Their Surroundings: By visiting their classrooms, bathrooms, and play areas multiple times, the school no longer feels overwhelming or unfamiliar. It's already becoming their space.
- Understanding Routines: They've practiced important 'big school' routines, such as lining up, packing their bags, following playground rules, and sitting patiently for story time.
- Learning Expected Behaviours: Through games and interaction, they are being introduced to the behavioural expectations for primary school, which helps ensure a positive and focused learning environment from Day One.
- Building Friendships: The ongoing interaction with their peers and their Buddies establishes social connections that ease the feeling of being alone in a new environment.

A Heartfelt Welcome Awaits

We want to sincerely thank the parents for supporting their children through this program. The 2026 Kindergarten cohort has settled in exceptionally well. They are happy, confident, and almost ready for the next big adventure! We look forward to officially welcoming our new students and families into the school community next year.

As the school moves into Advent and towards the end of Term 4, our community has been experiencing a busy and joy-filled term, particularly in our Mission space. Students and staff have been actively engaging in programs that deepen faith, strengthen community, and encourage service to others.

Timor-Leste Immersion 2025

Over the holiday break, 10 Year 11 students and two staff members participated in the Timor Immersion for 2025. A highlight was spending time in the village of Turiscai, where students experienced the warmth, generosity, and faith of the local community. Our partnership with the community continues to make a meaningful impact, contributing to new classrooms, a toilet block, and resources for both a music room and a computer lab at Lady Fatima School, Turiscai. Students visited several schools, leading English conversation groups and facilitating a range of classroom activities. The immersion also nurtured deep personal and spiritual growth, particularly through Mass and the powerful beauty of Timorese singing. We are immensely proud of our students' commitment, compassion, and willingness to walk alongside another culture in humility and service.

Senior Retreat

The Senior Retreat was held in Week Two of this term at the picturesque North Tamborine Mountains and brought the entire Year 11 cohort together in a peaceful and reflective environment. Students explored meaningful questions about direction, purpose, and the call to make a positive impact in the world. Using the compass as a guiding symbol, they considered the many paths life may offer while remembering their call to be Men and Women for Others. They reflected on the belief that God remains our True North, even when life feels uncertain or complex. Through prayer, discussion, and companionship, students deepened their understanding of their Catholic faith and Ignatian spirituality.

Kairos Retreat

A group of Year 10 students recently participated in the Kairos Retreat at Camp Drewe, supported by student leaders from Year 11 who had previously completed the program. The retreat was also accompanied by College Youth Ministers and teachers who helped guide the experience. Kairos is a unique peer-led retreat that encourages personal discovery, spiritual reflection, and community building. The experience was a



valuable opportunity for students to encounter God in one another and recognise His presence in their daily lives.

Australian Catholic Youth Festival

At the beginning of December, the College is sending 11 Year 9 Pilgrims to the Australian Catholic Youth Festival in Melbourne. A special highlight of the campout was a candlelit prayer reflection led by the children for their dads.



ST ANNES LONG DAY CARE CENTRE



St Anne's Long Day Care Centre has had a very full year of nurturing and supporting children's growth, learning and development, and working with families to ensure our work compliments the children's learning at home. As we honour this learning at home with the belief that families are children's first and most influential educators, we work in our professional capacity at St Anne's to engage children in learning in a social group learning setting using play-based pedagogies and curriculum to further children's curiosity, thinking, creativity and knowledge.

As Educators, it is at this time of the year, as we author Learning and Development Summaries for each child (a bit like a "school report"!), that we reflect on the individual growth in confidence, competence and that feeling of self, that is such an important part of life-long learning.

We reflect on:

- the growth of the "babies" (children in the age group of Birth to 2 years old) who are no longer held closely in the arms of the carers but are now toddling around their play environment connecting with each other and initiating play.
- the growth of the "toddlers" (children in the age group of 2 to 3 years old) who, now competent with their language, converse competently with their peers and teachers and articulate what they want, how they want things, and can verbally express their delight in learning experiences.
- the growth of the "Preschool" children (children who are in the age group of 3 to 5 years old), whose independence is now evident, their curiosity and motivation to seek out new experiences supporting their learning, and their interests voiced ensuring Educators can build on those interests as valuable learning experiences and opportunities.

Of the 32 Preschool children attending St Anne's who are preparing to transition to school in 2026, 27 children will transition to Parish schools (Holy Family Primary School and St Francis Xavier Primary School).

Children's health and safety is always of paramount importance in an early childhood education and care service and this year the Department of Education has put a spotlight on all children's services, ensuring children's safety is, at all times, the number one priority. From 1 September 2025 changes to the National Regulations for Early Childhood Education and Care services were introduced as part of the implementation of expedited recommendations from the Review of Child Safety Arrangements under the National Quality Framework to improve child safety. These changes included having a policy and clear procedures related to child protection, and, the safe use of digital technologies and online environments. There are now clear restrictions on the use of personal mobile phones and all personal electronic devices for those who are working at, or visiting, St Anne's, with the implementation of such policies and procedures as part of our commitment to child safety.

As we finish the year we reflect on the words of Magda Gerber (a pioneering infant specialist and Educator 1910-2007), Trust in the child as an initiator, explorer and self-learner. As we work alongside young children guiding and supporting their learning and development, we also support them to experience the sense of 'belonging, being and becoming' as unique individuals, creating and developing their own learning, their own identities and their own autonomy – this resonates with the national The Early Years Learning Framework (a framework of learning for all children from birth to 5 years of age and through the transition to school).

We now look forward to a new year of learning together in 2026.
