#### SOCIAL JUSTICE SUNDAY 'TO LIVE LIFE TO THE FULL' MENTAL HEALTH IN AUSTRALIA TODAY We will celebrate Social Justice Sunday next

Sunday 30th August. This year the Australian Bishop's Social Justice Statement is titled: 'To live life to the full: Mental Health in Australia today. The COVID-19 pandemic is affecting the mental health of many members of our parishes, schools and communities. Understanding mental health will help us to be aware of those who need our support. The Bishops invite us all to reject stigmatisation, to work for the transformation of social determinants of metal ill-health, and to call for policies and service provision that meets the needs of the poorest and most marginalised members of our community.

### **RECOGNISE THE DIGNITY IN EVERY PERSON** Pope Francis ~ 13th August 2020

Christian faith demands conversion from individualism and a commitment to defending the inherent dignity of every person' Pope Francis said.



While we work for the cure of a virus that effects everyone without distinction, faith

urges us to work seriously and actively to fight indifference in the face of violations of human dignity,' the Pope said. We want to recognise the human dignity in every person, whatever his or her race, language or condition might be'. Pope Francis emphasised that this 'renewed awareness of the dignity of every human being has serious social, economic and political implications.'

Pope Francis added that the pandemic has 'shed light on broader social ills' including 'a distorted view of the person' that ignores human dignity and 'fosters an individualistic and aggressive throw-away culture, which transforms the human being into a consumer good.

'In the light of faith we know, that God looks at a man and a woman in another manner. He created us not as objects but as people loved and capable of loving; He has created us in his image and likeness. In this way he has given ua s unique dignity, calling us to live in communion with him, in communion with our sisters and our brothers, with respect for all creation,' Pope Francis said.

'The pandemic has highlighted how vulnerable and interconnected we all are. If we do not take care of each other, starting with the least, with those who are most affected, including creation, we cannot heal the world,' he said.
