

#### CORONAVIRUS UPDATE-DECREES REGARDING MASS CLOSURES

As you all know, the Commonwealth Government has now banned all indoor gatherings of 100 or more people. As a consequence, I am obliged to make the following Decrees:

- SUNDAY MASS From and including this weekend there will be NO Sunday Masses in the Diocese and the Sunday obligation for our Faithful is suspended;
- CONFIRMATION, FIRST COMMUNION AND FIRST RECONCILIATION—will be postponed until further notice:
- RECONCILIATION There will be no Second Rite of Reconciliation until further notice; you may, however use the First Rite but must ensure there is the appropriate distance and if possible, there be a screen between the priest and the penitent;
- FUNERALS—Since we have no control over the number attending funerals, there will be no funeral liturgies in church. Prayers may be said at the place of burial;
- WEDDINGS—You should ensure that no more than 100 people, including yourself, attend at weddings. In the present circumstances, I would encourage wedding services in preference to as Nuptial Mass;
- EASTER—There will be no public Easter Liturgies;
- CHURCHES may remain open for the Faithful to come and pray.

Let us continue to pray for the protection of all people and the end of this virus.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

As Jesus went along, he saw a man who had been blind from birth. He spat on the ground, made a paste with the spittle, put this over the eyes of the blind man and said to him, 'Go and wash in the Pool of Siloam' (a name that means 'sent'). So the blind man went off and washed himself, and came away with his sight restored.

His neighbours and people who earlier had seen him begging said, 'Isn't this the man who used to sit and beg? Some said, 'Yes, it is the same one.' Others said, 'No, he only looks like him.' The man himself said, 'I am the man.' They brought the man who had been blind to the Pharisees. It had been a sabbath day when Jesus made the paste and opened the man's eyes, so when the Pharisees asked him how he had come to see, he said, 'He put a paste on my eyes, and I washed, and I can see.' Then some of the Pharisees said, 'This man cannot be from God: he does not keep the sabbath.' Others said, 'How could a sinner produce signs like this?' And there was disagreement among them. So they spoke to the blind man again, 'What have you to say about him yourself, now that he has opened your eyes?' 'He is a prophet' replied the man.

'Are you trying to teach us,' they replied 'and you a sinner through and through, since you were born!' And they drove him away.

Jesus heard they had driven him away, and when he found him he said to him, 'Do you believe in the Son of Man?' 'Sir,' the man replied 'tell me who he is so that I may believe in him.' Jesus said, 'You are looking at him; he is speaking to you.' The man said, 'Lord, I believe', and worshipped him.
