



To All Ballina Parishioners—St Francis Xavier Church

Procedure during COVID-19 Pandemic:

- 1. Only 45 (forty-five) people allowed to attend Mass at one time
- Parishioners will need to ring the Parish Office to <u>REGISTER</u> name, address and phone number (DURING OFFICE HOURS ONLY) For Weekend Masses names must be registered by <u>3.00 pm on the Friday</u> proceeding the weekend.
 NO ONE CAN JUST TURN UP!
- 3. Parishioners who attend need to **SANITISE** and try to refrain from touching surfaces when finding a place-marked \mathbf{X} to sit
- 4. Parishioners need to sit on and only where the X is marked
- 5. Consideration, please; to be given to ALL parishioners so that everyone has a chance to attend a Mass
- 6. At risk parishioners should be exhorted not to attend: authorities have directed that any unwell priest, staff member, volunteer or parishioners should stay away; they recommend that people with co-morbidities (e.g. compromised immune or respiratory systems) and those over 70 years of age exercise particular caution; (from Government and Bishop guidelines)
- **7. Social distancing** is still required according to Government Regulations.
- 8. Only one entrance side north door only Exit for front section of church only from the south side door and back south door of church


REFLECTION

This feast harkens back to the celebration of Holy Thursday. By way of the metaphors of food and drink, its readings provide us with a look at the mystery of divine presence. They first provide a picture of a God who feeds us. In the past God set a table in freedom, and then provided food that enabled our ancestors to survive. God fed those who were needy, not those who were worthy. Jesus offered sustenance to the crowds that gathered around him. It was not manna from heaven that he offered but his own flesh and blood as food and drink. This food and drink are the pledge of eternal life.

Those who eat this bread and drink this cup are caught up in a profound unity with God, a unity not envisioned in the wilderness experience. There is a new overlay of significance.

Jesus' claim to give his flesh and blood was a bold one, Paul's seems even bolder. He states that partaking of the bread and the cup not only joins us with Christ, but actually makes us participants in the body and blood of Christ. Humanity and divinity are joined as one. The Eucharist is a sign of unity in another way. Joined to the body and blood of Christ, we are joined to each other. We are one body and that body is Christ. The Eucharist is truly a celebration of thanksgiving: thanksgiving for our transformation and thanksgiving for our unity.

Margaret Mary Alacoque said that in her apparitions Jesus promised these blessings to those who practice devotion to his Sacred Heart. The list was tabulated in 1863. In 1882 an American businessman spread the tabular form of the twelve promises throughout the world, in 238 languages. In 1890 Cardinal Adolph Perraud deplored this circulation of the promises in tabular form, which he said were different from the words and the meaning of the expressions used by Saint Margaret Mary, and wanted the promises to be published in their original words.

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- 4. I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
- 5. I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
- 9. I will bless those places wherein the image of My Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
- 10. I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.

In the excess of the mercy of my Heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour. www.catholic.org/
