



In 1930s, Our Lord Jesus himself requested, through St Faustina, that a Feast of Divine Mercy be established and solemnly celebrated in His Church on the octave of Easter—the First Sunday

after Easter.

In 2000, Pope John Paul II fulfilled the will of Christ and officially established the Universal Feast of Divine Mercy and he added a special Plenary Indulgence to Divine Mercy Sunday. To fittingly observe the Sunday of Divine Mercy, we encouraged to precede the Feast by reciting the nine-day Novena of Divine Mercy, beginning on Good Friday. (Said privately.)
