

Communion Antiphon: Blessed are you, O Virgin Mary, by the Lord God Most High, above all women on the earth; for he has so exalted your name, that your praise shall be undying on our lips.

DID YOU KNOW? *The reason why the disciples were in Jerusalem on the day of Pentecost was that they were celebrating the Jewish Harvest Festival which occurs fifty days after the Passover. This festival also celebrated the covenant made by God with the people of Israel on Mt Sinai.

*The Christian feast of Pentecost is fifty days after Easter Sunday and marks the culmination and closure of the Lent- Easter-Pentecost cycle.

*The word for spirit in Hebrew is the feminine 'ruah', meaning literally breath, wind or air.

MAKING CONNECTIONS *The first reading tells of the experience of the disciples receiving the Spirit. They were astounded by what had happened to them and it produced a change in them as people. Share stories of times you have been 'blown away' by something. Did the experience produce lasting change? How have you kept this feeling alive?

*The Spirit is bestowed at baptism and 'confirmed' for us. Galatians 5:22 lists the fruits of the Spirit as love, joy, peace,

patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Try to live these fruits this week.

*Today's gospel acclamation makes a wonderful prayer for this week:

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful; And kindle in them the fire of your love
