FROM THE HOLY FAMLY LENNOX HEAD COMMITTEE SUE HETHERINGTON, CHAIR HELHC

Holy Family Church is the throbbing heartbeat of Lennox Heart. It is where we meet to receive the Eucharist and Sacraments, where children and parents gather in its grounds celebrating the Love Lennox Festival and where older surfers regroup after a surf, sheltering in the sunshine, backs against the wall, before assembling their surf gear and heading home. It is where the car park gate is opened to permit community groups access for nearby events.

For eight weeks I have sorely missed our church, as I cared for my severely ill 93- year-old mum. Thank you for your kind words and prayers which have manifested incredible graces on mum's recovery journey. The Gifts of Service invitation will continue when I return.

St Francis Xavier parishioners were highly visible in Lennox Head on Saturday 12th October, gathering with community members beside the ocean to say a very Public Rosary. Children, youth, young adults and older people assembled on picnic rugs, seats and wheelie walkers. Over 50 people, including Father Richard Foley, came to be still, pray the Rosary and sing Marian hymns. Both the Xavier College Youth Minister and the Parish Youth Coordinator led the Litany to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Marie Sullivan beautifully coordinated the Rosary in a public space and Committee members Cheryl and Peter Bowen coordinated morning tea.

St Francis Xavier Parish annually welcomes parishioners, members of other faith traditions and the general public to actively join with 150 countries and 1.5 million Christians, to be one of 25,708 prayer services in 90 languages that travel across every time zone, praying for peace and justice. The event is the World Day of Prayer. I Made You Wonderful is the 2025 theme, to be held on Friday 7th March in St Francis Xavier Church. We will pray for the people of the Cook Islands, in this 97th year of the World Day of Prayer. We invite Cook Island parishioners from or with links to the Cook Islands, their family members and friends to contact us, to share their culture as we pray for them.

Devotion to the Holy Face of Jesus welcomes all parishioners to pray together every Tuesday, commencing at 10 a.m. Lennox Head men are invited to join others weekly for prayer and fellowship in the Sacred Heart room. Coordinator Murray Parr is organising an active Men's Retreat on 30th November. Please contact Murray on 0414399658 for further details.




FROM THE PARISH FINANCE COUNCIL

There are several works either recently completed or in the pipeline:

- · A carport has been erected in the Parish Administration Carpark. The structure serves to not only protect staff cars but also to provide outdoor shelter for Parish Functions.
- Works are ongoing at the Lennox Head Church.
- The statue of St Francis Xavier and the white cross at the front of the Ballina Church and the statue of Mary in front of Parish Administration have all been restored.
- The bell tower and bell are being restored as the bell fixings had become unstable.
- A bathroom in 1 Byron Street, Lennox Head will be refurbished shortly due to leaks.
- The repair of the exposed steel work at Moriah House is being investigated.
 - A major project is being undertaken at Crowley with the construction of twenty six (26) independent living apartments at the end of Florence Price Place

LENNOX MEN ALIVE

The Lennox menAlive Coffee Mornings have become a beacon of connection, support, and spiritual growth for the men in our community. Held every second Wednesday, these gatherings are more than just a time to share a cup of coffee; they represent an opportunity to check in on one another's mental health, support each other through life's ups and downs, and strengthen our relationships with God and our families.

A Space for Honest Conversations

At the heart of our coffee mornings is the desire to create a safe, welcoming space for men to talk about their mental health openly. Too often, men feel pressured to handle their struggles alone. At Lennox menAlive, we strive to break this cycle by encouraging honest conversations about the challenges we face—whether related to work, family, or personal well-being. Each session starts with a simple yet powerful "check-in," where we share how we're doing emotionally, mentally, and spiritually. This practice helps us stay attuned to each other's needs and reminds us that we are not alone in our battles.

The strength of these mornings lies in the genuine care and camaraderie we experience. We listen, encourage, and remind each other that it's ok not always to be OK. Together, we provide an environment where vulnerability is met with understanding and where every man is valued.

Strengthening Families Through Fellowship

Our conversations often extend beyond our own well-being to include the welfare of our families. As husbands, fathers, brothers, and sons, we acknowledge the important roles we play in the lives of our loved ones. The discussions at our coffee mornings help us become more present and supportive in our family relationships. We share advice, offer prayers, and give each other the strength to navigate family challenges with grace and wisdom.

By sharing our stories and experiences, we equip one another to be better leaders within our homes, more loving fathers, and compassionate partners. The fellowship we experience helps us build stronger, healthier families, grounded in love and faith.

Rooted in God's Word

A central part of our time together is the opportunity to engage with God's Word. Each gathering includes a moment of reflection on Scripture, which serves as the foundation for much of our discussion and personal growth. We take turns reading passages from the Bible, and together, we reflect on how these teachings can be applied in our daily lives.

This spiritual nourishment is essential. It keeps us focused on our faith and reminds us of the importance of leaning on God, especially in times of difficulty. Through the lens of Scripture, we gain

new perspectives on how to approach life's challenges, and we are constantly reminded of God's unfailing love and guidance. Whether it's a lesson on forgiveness, trust, or resilience, our discussions help us grow in our relationship with God and shape our attitudes toward life's trials.

We are always looking for other men to join us in this fellowship, support, and spiritual growth journey. If you're looking for a place to connect, to be heard, and to grow in your faith, we invite you to come along to one of our coffee mornings. YOUTH GROUP

The SFX Youth Group has undergone a brand change to the "Upper Room Youth Group" remembering the place Jesus and His disciples gathered to break bread, raise their hearts in prayer and be ultimately transformed and united in Christ. Under the mantle of "@ballina.youth" the Upper Room Youth Group has also changed to Sunday evenings 6:00pm-8:00pm during the school term. After this change, we have seen an increase in attendance, and overwhelming positive feedback from both parents and students.

Over the past few months we have participated in games and movie nights, and were joined by a host of exchange students from Japan - who we celebrated an 'Aussie Night' with, where we celebrated all things Australian, from food and games to the classic nutbush.



Members of the youth group also surprised one of our youth ministers by dressing like him for 'Dress Like Brendon Night' - where we saw many costumes including, but not limited to 'Cricket Brendon', 'Bowls Brendon', and many more.

Members of our youth group also had the opportunity to attend the Diocesean Discipleship events, Shine, Festa Christi, and the upcoming GOAT retreat. Here they spent time connecting with other students from around our Diocese, experiencing reflective prayer activities, prayer teams, the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion, worship music, and chances for dynamic faith formation. Members of the Upper Room Youth Group also attended the annual Ignite Conference in Brisbane for four days in September. At Ignite they were able to meet students from other Parishes and schools, attend workshops, listen to keynote speakers, and participate in youth rallies led by Emmanuel Worship.

During the October school holidays members of our youth group and their families joined with the wider Parish community to participate in the Nation Wide Rosary Chain, hosted in Lennox Head.



We have returned for Term 4, on Sundays 6:00-8:00pm in the Parish Upper Room. The first youth group back was a fun night at the bowling alley where we were able to welcome new and returning members.

ST VINCENT DE PAUL

The third article covering the activities of Vinnies in the Parish is about Mary's Place which was an initiative between our Parish and Vinnies. It was opened in 2020, is located at the corner of Moon Street and Treelands Crescent. It is a drop in centre providing support and guidance to individuals and families experiencing homelessness, disadvantage and social isolation. It works in a close relationship with Vinnies welfare group as both these arms are focused on assisting the disadvantaged within community.

Between 250 and 300 people call at Mary's Place each week for assistance which could be breakfast, morning tea, a take away meal or just a cold drink. Besides feeding those who call into Mary's Place they are also provided showers, laundry, clothing, computing, phone charging and if necessary baggage storage. Next time you are passing, stop, call in and experience the hospitality provided by Bryan, the Manager, and his staffing volunteers who assist with food preparation and cooking.

Mary's Place has two other unique services, namely, Crisis Support and Case Management through the Social Workers employed. These have strong relationships with a number of local community services. They also provide counselling and referral services to patrons.

Mary's Place is overwhelmingly funded by the St Vincent de Paul Society NSW. It also relies on support of donations and through successful grant applications. It does not receive any government funding. Recently a group of lady parishioners formed a Friends of Mary's Place group to raise funds to help Mary's Place in its

TAIZÉ

On the prepared focus table in front of Our Ladv's altar in St Francis Xavier's Church, the candle light reminds us that Jesus is the Light of the World. The music gently begins. It is a welcome to those gathering to pray. Hearts and minds focussed on Jesus. Words of praise. Music. Prayer and praise. COMPLETE STILLNESS AND SILENCE for a short time no prayers, no thoughts - just openness of heart and mind to the Holy Spirit. Then some gentle music leads us into prayers of supplication or a litany of praise of our Saviour. Together we raise our voices in the Lord's Prayer. The Final Blessing and music. No one moves now; it is hard to leave. Everything is still. The quiet sacred space is perfect for humble union with the Almighty. A slight movement signals it is time to go and with the blessings received in this short time in prayer, we are encouraged to take the Good News of the Word to others. In an ecumenical spirit the focus is always simplicity, kindness and reconciliation of heart. The spirit of Taizé lives on.



Let us be the 'sign of Christ among men and bearers of joy'.

DEVOTION TO THE HOLY FACE OF JESUS

In the Old testament the Holy Face of God is mentioned many times. The Psalmist writes "O Lord, show us Thy Face and we shall be saved". When the "Word became flesh and dwelt amongst us" (John 1.14) the Divine Face became the Face of Jesus Christ, our Saviour. In memory of His sacrificial suffering our Lord left us with miraculous imprints of His Holy Face, the Veil of Veronica and The Shroud of Turin.

In 1843 Jesus communicated with a Carmelite Nun, Sister Mary of St Peter and again one hundred years later with Blessed Mother Maria Pierina de Michelli. On both occasions he asked that His Holy Face be venerated and honoured. Our Lord said to Sister Mary of St Peter "According to the care you take in making reparation to My Face, disfigured by blasphemers, so will I take care of yours which has been disfigured by sin". In 1936 our Lord said "I wish that my Face which reflects the intimate sorrow of my Soul and the suffering and love of my Heart, be better honoured. He who contemplates me consoles me".

There is much to learn about this much needed Devotion, its origins, purpose and the promises Our Lord made to those who honour His Divine Countenance. Our Year 11 students have begun their HSC journey, and with that came the appointment of our new student leaders for 2024-2025. Our student leaders recently participated in their Student Leadership Formation Camp. Blessed with beautiful weather, the group enjoyed a day at Ballina Surf Club, including a picturesque Ignatius and Bundjalung walk along Lighthouse Beach. Students participated in engaging activities like indoor rock climbing and a spirited house-based sandcastle competition. These activities set the stage for more focused sessions on leadership development, where students explored what it means to lead in an Ignatian and Catholic school. They also examined the leadership qualities of notable figures across politics, sports, and mission work, and reflected on their personal purpose as leaders — finding their "why" and understanding the essential role of student leaders in our community.

Mission News

Community Connections with St Andrew's Aged Care

Our Year 4 students have been fortunate to visit St Andrew's Aged Care here in Ballina. Across two visits, the students have shared stories and played games with the residents. These visits coincide with the students' studies in Religious Education, where they are learning about Mary, the Mother of God. Part of the unit of work asks students to identify needs in our world which require a response.

Whole School Retreat

On Monday 22 October we shared in a whole school Retreat about Creation, led by our Year 6 students. As part of their learning in Religious Education last term, the Year 6 students encouraged us to be stewards of God's Creation and asked us how we can better care for God's creation. The students designed engaging learning opportunities for all classes throughout the school. It was incredible to see their ingenuity and



differentiation across the Year levels. The creativity and use of technology ensured our students were highly engaged in their learning. It was a wonderful day of learning and fun and again we thank our Year 6 students and teachers for a great day.

Learning and Teaching News

Japanese

In Japanese the students have been learning to write a simple description of their pet. They needed to describe its colour, size, and age. The students could then read it in Japanese and translate it back into English.

Kindergarten Mathematics

In Kindergarten Mathematics the students were focusing on estimating how many objects they had in the handful they had grabbed. They then arranged them so it was easy to see how many there were without counting them. The students then went on a gallery walk and identified groups of objects that were easy to know how many there were altogether. They needed to be able to justify why. This time they ascertained it was easier to count arrangements that were arranged in 2's, 5's and 10's. Everyone then had the opportunity to rearrange their quantities and share why with their learning partner.

Year Four Mathematics

In Year 4 the students have been learning about symmetry, tessellation, rotations, reflections, and translations in Mathematics. They explored the work of artist M.C. Escher whose work is famous for its intricate tessellations and impossible constructions. His prints, such as "Reptiles" or "Sky and Water," show how repeating patterns and transformations can create fascinating visual effects.







ST ANNES LONG DAY CARE CENTRE



Special celebrations are an important part of our work with even our youngest children. Learning about how we are connected to the larger community and the bigger world occurs through these special celebrations. Each year we celebrate and acknowledge The Feast of St Anne's Day (July 26) by gathering together, saying a prayer to St Anne, singing, dancing, and feasting (usually on patty cakes!). Our unique timber statues, of St Anne and her daughter Mary, crafted by Adam Sullivan-Holy Family School Assistant Principal, stand proudly at the entrance of St Anne's reminding all of us of the significance of a mother and child relationship.

In September the children participated in an interactive Drumming Workshop making loud beats and rhythms to "raise the roof". The Tissue Fairy also visited to help us teach the children of the importance of blowing noses correctly to ensure healthy ears. Conductive hearing loss (Otitis Media) has a debilitating impact on children's hearing and has a direct link to delays in speech and language development. Part of our daily work is to support young children's communication, speech and language.

The Native Bee Company Education Officer visited our Preschool children to help them learn more about the important work of native bees and pollination. We have 3 native bee hives at St Anne's and gardens cared for by Educators and children. Connecting the children with nature, our country, our land and introducing them to sustainable practices is also an important part of our education programmes at St Anne's.

In October we acknowledged and celebrated National Children's Week with all of St Anne's children and Educators participating together in a 'Teddy Bear's Picnic' on our outside 'Green Space'. Children's Week is celebrated each year with a theme based on an Article from the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC). Every two years a new theme is chosen. The theme for this year was based on Article 24 focusing on the right of children to a clean and safe environment. As well, we celebrated NSW Grandparents' Day by inviting all Grandparents and "Grand-friends" to visit their grandchildren during a morning or afternoon session in the last week of October. What a great week with 111 "visitors" joining us over that week, as well as some (who are currently overseas) sending videos with greetings!

Our year of growing, developing and learning, for this year, is fast coming to an end. As children get ready to transition into their next age group room at the start of 2025, we also prepare for our 5 year old Preschoolers (in the Seabirds Room), to spread their wings and fly high off to Kindergarten for their first year of formal education at school. We have children transitioning to St Francis Xavier Primary School Ballina, Holy Family Primary School Skennars Head and St Finbarr's Primary School Byron Bay.

We are privileged each year to share in such young children's Early Childhood Education and Care.
