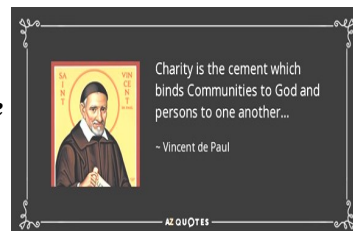

Bringing joy to others

Father Anthony had a reputation of being a 'giant' among the Redemptorists and in the Church. He was a highly respected missionary priest, preacher, confessor, teacher, author, and spiritual director.

My experience of Anthony was not as a 'giant'. I never saw him stand. I never saw him walk. I never saw him celebrate Mass. I never heard him preach. My experience of Anthony was as a beloved confrere, confined to bed battling Parkinson's disease and suffering greatly from its effects.

One memory of Anthony will always remain with me. I was saying goodbye to him one day before going away for work. He said to me, Thank you for spending time with me, otherwise I would be here shaking alone." Anthony was referring to the constant tremors that racked his body, particularly his hands and arms.

This simple encounter with Anthony was a turning point for me; a valuable life lesson. His words really struck a chord and they roused me from my slumber. His words challenged me to be more attentive to people and their needs and to appreciate what's really important and of value in life. Anthony's powerful statement taught me that I don't have to do very much to bring a little happiness, love, joy and companionship into someone's life.

I left Anthony's room that day filled with new understanding and insight; sent out to live differently and to relate to people around me with renewed purpose.

Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River is a major turning point in his life. After decades of silent obscurity in Nazareth, Jesus is overwhelmed by an experience of being the Son of God: "This is my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased". Through these words, Jesus profoundly experiences that he is loved and delighted in by his Father and he's never the same again. He doesn't look back. Gone are his days of plying the carpenter's trade.

Now Jesus sets out on his mission to preach, teach and heal. He generously shares with everyone, the love and intimacy he experienced at his baptism, because God says to every person: You are my beloved son.

He reveals God's love to the whole world. Jesus is also ready to challenge his contemporaries by taking the side of the poor against their oppressors; helping people reclaim their God-given humanity and dignity. Everything Jesus says and does during his public ministry comes from his intimate communion with his Father, so clearly demonstrated at his baptism.

You are my beloved. Today, God says this to each one of us, with immense love and delight. May these words be a turning point in our lives that lead us closer to God and each other.

REFLECTION : 'We are not made for a life where everything is taken for granted and static,' Pope Leo says, 'but for an existence that is constantly renewed through gift of self in love.' Our baptismal calling is, after all, a call to action!

'There is a burning question in our hearts,' the Pope reflects, 'a need for truth that we cannot ignore, which leads us to ask ourselves: what is true happiness? What is the true meaning of life? What can free us from being trapped in meaninglessness, boredom and mediocrity?'

The Pope encourages us to recollect that 'the fullness of our existence does not depend on what we store up.' As we return from the holiday season to Ordinary Time, we may well reflect on this: Life is about more than possessions.

'We need to lift our eyes,' the Pope says, and 'realise that everything in the world has meaning only insofar as it serves to unite us to God and to our brothers and sisters in charity.'

We should, the Pope says, appreciate that 'fullness has to do with what we joyfully welcome and share.' Our lives are more fulsome when they are open to celebrating the gifts and serving the needs of others. © Nick Brodie Liturgy Help

DID YOU KNOW?

- The Jordan River runs the length of Israel, from north of the Sea of Galilee to the Dead Sea in the south, and is the life-blood of the land.
 - The exact site of the baptism of Jesus by John is unknown, but the traditional site is at el-Mughtas, about ten and a half kilometres north of the point where the river enters the Dead Sea.
 - The word baptism comes from a Greek word meaning 'to plunge'.
 - The first Christians were baptised by being plunged into running streams or rivers, following the practice of John.
- Later, large fonts were built in churches, and baptism of the faithful, usually adults, was by full immersion.
