



Fleeing from their home

The story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt following the birth of Jesus in Bethlehem is only told in the Gospel of Matthew which also tells us of the visit of the Magi or wise men from the East.

In fact, it is the visit of the Magi following a star that alerts the paranoid King Herod to suspect a future rebellion against his authority. He therefore orders the death of all male children under two in his jurisdiction of Judea, which included Bethlehem and Jerusalem.

Joseph learns about this confronting situation from an angel in a dream telling him to escape into Egypt with Mary and the child Jesus. Egypt was a logical place of refuge. Although part of the Roman empire, it was of outside Herod's control. More than likely, the family would have travelled through current-day Gaza and the northern Sinai coast to relative safety – noting that some cities and towns along the way and in Egypt had had significant Jewish communities.

Joseph had the distinct advantage of being a tradesman which meant he could pick up work in many places. Although we are not given a timeframe of the Holy Family's stay in Egypt, some early Coptic Christian writers suggest they may have been there for several years. Then, as told by Matthew, Joseph receives another dream message telling him to return to Israel in view of Herod's death.

In Matthew's account, there is no evidence of Joseph and Mary living in Nazareth prior to the birth of Jesus. However, on finding that Herod's son Archelaus had replaced his father Herod as ruler of Judea, Joseph decided they should settle elsewhere, namely a town called Nazareth in Galilee. As Nazareth was also within walking distance to nearby Sepphoris – a town being rebuilt at the time – this provided Joseph, and most likely Jesus later on, with carpentry work.

The significance of Egypt in the Jesus' story is stark. After all, it was in Egypt where Jews were made slaves prior to the time of Moses who led them out of slavery to the Promised Land of Israel. Then we note in Matthew's story the prophecy of Hosea 11:1 which states: "Out of Egypt I have called my Son". We also note the significant role Matthew attributes to Joseph as a descendant of King David. As the legal father of Jesus, Joseph provided the Davidic royal line, fulfilling Old Testament prophecies that the promised Messiah would be from the House of David.

In celebrating the Holy Family's flight into Egypt, we are reminded of the many refugee families throughout history and in our world today who seek safety in foreign lands. We also live in a time when there appears to be a growing negativity to immigrants, whatever their reasons for migrating. No doubt Joseph, Mary and Jesus also suffered negativity in view of their Jewish faith and culture.

So, let us pray today for all families and peoples forced from their homelands.

REFLECTION

Herod is seeking to annihilate all the male children in Bethlehem. The child Jesus is in mortal danger. 'Arise, take the child and his mother, and flee into Egypt.' And Joseph did so. *That* night and *by* night, such was the urgency.

Have you ever thought: What if Egyptian border guards had turned back this refugee family? What if, instead of finding safe haven and sanctuary, this desperate family had been denied entry? The Divine plan to rescue Jesus from a murderous tyrant depended not only on Joseph but, also, on the Egyptian people.

And so we discover two Holy Families in this Gospel episode. One is the little Holy Family with Joseph, Mary and Jesus. The

other is the larger Holy Family of humanity embodied in those Egyptians who provided sanctuary, who opened their land to allow Joseph, Mary and Jesus to settle out of danger.

We might pause for a moment to ask: Can we be as hospitable and open as the Egyptians of today's Gospel? Another baby in another family of refugees may depend on our answer!

It is fitting that on New Year's Day we celebrate *the* calendar-shattering event in human history: the extraordinary role that a young woman in Galilee played in God's plan for the human race.

In the Western Church, the young woman is titled 'Mother of God'. This signifies a relationship, a loving, nurturing relationship. We know that it encompassed a mother's horror of seeing her son tortured and done to death on the Cross.

Yes, she was a mother, but Mother of *God*.

How can this be portrayed for our minds to grasp? In the Book of Genesis, the creative act which began all reckoning of the passage of time and seasons was signalled by the Divine Wind hovering over the formless void.

When that Holy Gust hovered over Mary, and she responded: 'Be it done unto me according to thy Word', the human existence of Our Lord Jesus Christ began, the fulcrum of history from which our calendar begins.

We could pause for a moment to pray that at the end of all history, at the end of all calendars, we may share in Divine life with Mary of Galilee, Mother of God.

And fulfilled: may the peace of Christ reign in your hearts, because it is for

this that you were called together as parts of one body. Always be thankful.

Let the message of Christ, in all its richness, find a home with you. Teach each other, and advise each other, in all wisdom. With gratitude in your hearts sing psalms and hymns and inspired songs to God; and never say or do anything except in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Wives, give way to your husbands, as you should in the Lord. Husbands, love your wives and treat them with gentleness. Children, be obedient to your parents always, because that is what will please the Lord. Parents, never drive your children to resentment or you will make them feel frustrated.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to St Matthew

After the wise men had left, the angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you, and escape into Egypt, and stay there until I tell you, because Herod intends to search for the child and do away with him.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, left that night for Egypt, where he stayed until Herod was dead. This was to fulfil what the Lord had spoken through the prophet:

I called my son out of Egypt.

After Herod's death, the angel of the Lord appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother with you and go back to the land of Israel, for those who wanted to kill the child are dead.' So Joseph got up and, taking the child and his mother with him, went back to You are God's chosen race, his saints; he loves you and you the land of Israel. But when he learnt that Archelaus had succeeded his father Herod as ruler of Judaea he was afraid to go there, and being warned in a dream he left for the region of Galilee. There he settled in a town called Nazareth.
